Quarterly Report**

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to detail London City Airport Corporate Social Responsibility activities to the London City Airports Consultative Committee members as well as the local community.

This report covers the activities of 2017 and the period between August - November 2017.

Education

- **Stem in aviation** - A total of 214 secondary school students from schools in East London participated in our flagship educational event. This event aims to give young East Londoners insight in the application of science and technology in the aviation industry and to inspire them to choose Science, Technology, Engineering and Math's (STEM) subjects in school. - **Primary School Tours** - Delivered 50 tours to 2104 students since start of 2017
- **Work Week (15 billion EBP)** - Engaged with 185 students across 6 primary schools underneath LCY's flight path
- **Future Prospects (15 billion EBP)** - 80 students, 5 schools from Barking and Dagenham and Waltham Forest

Higher Education

- A total of 140 students from the University of Westminster came to the airport for a presentation and an extensive airside tour.
- 110 students from Bedfordshire University visited the airport as part of our aviation experience partnership with Emirates Aviation Experience.

Employability

Take Off Into Work (TOIW): This flagship local employment scheme provides Newham residents over the age of 18 with a variety of training, work experience and first-hand access to onsite job opportunities.

- 41 Newham residents into work so far this year
- In total 649 people have been employed

Fight for Peace partnership launch: Training programme that aims to prepare young people in Newham, Greenwich, Redbridge, Waltham Forest, Tower Hamlets, Barking and Dagenham and Bexley for employment through a combination of training courses and sport engagement.

A Total of 57 people have undertaken employment related courses.

LCY work experience programme - 27 student have had work experience at London City Airport

Train to take off Redbridge - In partnership with Work Redbridge, LCY funded a hospitality training course for 24 Redbridge residents. The participants received a level 2 Food Hygiene certificate, Food and Bar Licencing training and Employability Skills training.

Career Fairs - A total of 587 local residents received insights in career options at LCY through the Redbridge Jobs and Apprenticeship fair, Waltham Forest Careers fair and The Royal Docks Learning and Activity centre careers fair.

Community Engagement

Community airport tours - 29 tours have been conducted for members of the local community. We also hosted the Roding Probus Club coffee morning at the airport.

British Legion remembrance service - LCY part sponsored the annual Royal British Legion Remembrance service. In addition to this LCY participated in the National British Legion poppy appeal.

Community Investment

Volunteering - 109 staff donated 760 hours through activities ranging from volunteering fortnight, participating in mock interviews and through aspirational talks.

Richard House Children's Hospice - Richard House is a charity located in Beckton (Newham) and they provide care and respite for children with life limiting conditions and diseases. So far this year, we have raised £36,300 through donation boxes, charity bike ride and in-kind donations.

30th Anniversary Fund - To mark London City Airport's 30th Anniversary celebrations a £30,000 fund has been awarded to 14 different local organisations in East London below.
